Pastels on High

In October, 2005, the Pastels on High committee began it's work on the October, 2006, POH International Exhibition. The exhibition opens at the Chablis Gallery in Placerville on October 9, and closes on October 28 of this year. This is one of the few "pastel only" shows that take place in this part of the country and you all should be preparing your entries. You still have plenty of time to put the finishing touches to your paintings. In order to enter the show, however, you will need a good slide of your painting that is received by me no later than August 7th.

It is not too difficult to prepare a good slide. You will need the following items: a 35 mm single lens reflex camera, a roll of 200 or 400 slide film, your paintings unframed and a small roll of silver colored mylar tape. (This tape can be purchased at a camera shop.) You will need to allow at least 2 weeks for the development of the film so your photos have to be taken no later than the 20th of July. I have my slides developed at our local Longs drugstore and have had very good luck. Take your photos as close up as possible in full sun. Put the paintings level or on an easel. Sit on the ground if necessary, or stand so that you are aiming the camera straight at your painting. Take at least 4-6 shots of each painting. If you can get close enough so that no edges show and your full image is in the camera, that is best. If not, that is where the mylar tape comes in.

After you get the slides back examine them closely. There should be nothing showing in the slide but the painting. (No mats, no fingers holding the painting, etc.) If you have any edges that need to be covered, cut a small piece of the mylar tape that is just shorter than the length of the slide and place it on the back side (the side with the printing) of the slide so it just covers the extraneous material. Rub it gently but thoroughly so it adheres to the slide. If you have photographed a vertical or horizontal narrow painting, you may need to use more than one strip of the tape. Do not touch the film itself with your fingers. The mylar tape will be black when it is projected and the only image will be your beautiful painting.

If this is all too much trouble, there are many wonderful photographers in our area. But once again, you had better get busy so your slides will be ready before the entry deadline.

Getting Your Art On-line

Several people have contacted me about submitting paintings to our website. It is fairly easy to have your art posted at our website and this is a great way to share your work on-line.

There are two places where a member's painting can appear on the SPS Website, the Member Gallery and the Home Page.

The Member Gallery is a page that lists each member. If you would like, an image of one of your paintings can be included by your name. Our web master, Steve Arrigotti, charges \$5 to add an image to the membership page. (In the initial start-up of our website, Steve added images as part of his overall fee for setting up the website. Now we are paying for updates.) Steve also charges \$20 to set up a small webpage with 4 images. You may contact Steve directly on this (see the following article).

The Home Page features paintings by member artists that have won awards, with preference given to paintings awarded Best of Show, People's Choice, or 1st place at a SPS-sponsored show. The page features six paintings, one at a time; the paintings change each time the page is opened or refreshed. If you would like to have one of your paintings considered for the Home Page send it to me. The painting should be saved as a jpg file @72 dpi and the longest side should measure 6.0".

The paintings on the homepage will be changed periodically. When I get a new group of six images and a few months have gone by, we'll forward the images to Steve to be posted at our website. At the moment I need a few more to have our second set of six paintings.

Here is information from Steve about having your own webpage (this is a reprint from the March-April 2006 newsletter).

Hello Artists,

For any member that is interested I'll be happy to add a page with your artwork to the Sierra Pastel Society website.

My charge for a single page is \$20 payable after I upload and you approve the page.

Your Input:

The following items are included on the page and should be sent to me via email to: steve@arrigotti.net

Please put "pastel society web page" in the subject line so I don't think it is spam.

- 4 images saved as jpeg's @72 dpi. The longest edge should be 4.0"
- If you want to add titles, sizes, prices and medium send that information in the body of the email.
- If you want to include a VERY brief artist statement (1 or 2 short sentences) send that information in the body of the email.
- If you have an existing web site include the complete URL (domain name) and I'll link to it from the page.
- If you have an email address send that information in the body of the email.

***What's not included** on this page is phone #, mailing address, classes, workshops, schedule of events etc. As a member of the Sierra Pastel all/some of these **MAY** be included elsewhere on the website.
